• Asking God for guidance

Don't be afraid to ask God for guidance. You will find many such requests in the Bible (Ps 25:4-5, 27:11, 43:3, 61:2, 143:7-10, 119:133, Jer 6:16).

• Conscience

Our conscience is our internal indicator of right and wrong (Rom 2:14-15). If we do right we have a clear conscience (Acts 24:16, 1 Peter 3:16) and if we do wrong we have a guilty conscience (Ps 51).

Unfortunately as sinful human beings our consciences can be weak (1 Cor 8:7), seared (1 Tim 4:2) or corrupted (Titus 1:15) and so they are not perfect indicators of right and wrong (Eph 4:17-19). Jesus came both to cleanse our guilty consciences by his death on the cross (Heb 10:19-22) and to correct our faulty consciences by the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

• Guidance by events

• Circumstances — These are the normal events of life happening around us which direct our lives (Josh 2:23-24, Ruth 2:2-3, Acts 6:1-4, 20:3).

• Signs — Signs are unusual, unlikely or supernatural events which convince us that God is directing us in a particular way (Ex 13:21-22, Judg 7:9-15).

• Fleece — This is named after Gideon's fleece (Judg 6:36-40). Guidance is sought by asking for a specific sign (Gen 24:10-27).

• Vow — A vow is a solemn promise made to God that if certain events take place then you will pursue a course of action (Gen 28:20-22). Vows should not be taken lightly (Deut 23:21-23, Judg 11:29-40, Jer 42:1-43:4).

• Chance — This is drawing lots, tossing a coin or using some other chance method to make a decision (1 Sam 14:36-42, Prov 16:33, Jonah 1:7, Acts 1:26) — not recommended! It is possible that the Urim and Thummim used by the priests in the Old Testament relied on this method (Ex 28:30, Num 27:21).

• Forbidden methods of guidance

Some methods of guidance are clearly forbidden (Lev 19:31, Deut 18:10-12, Is 8:19-20).

- Fortune telling, divination, omens

- Mediums, spiritists and consulting the dead
- Occult practices, witchcraft and sorcery

• Free choice and God's control

The Bible clearly teaches that God is in overall charge of the universe, yet within that we have our own free choice. This is hard for us to understand! God calls, rules and guides — we can choose to align our lives with his purposes or we can disobey and step outside God's will. We are responsible for our decisions and our choices.

- **God's control** — Ps 135:6, Rom 8:28-30, Eph 1:3-14, Gal 1:15, James 4:13-15
- **Our choice** — Josh 24:15, Deut 30:19
- **Both** — Prov 16:9, Acts 2:23

• Back on track - redemption

We make bad decisions for different reasons.

- In all good faith we sought guidance, believing at the time that the decision was right, but we were mistaken — we have a good God and can be sure that he will help us through our difficulties.
- Or it may be that we did not seek guidance from God or were rebellious in our decision — we need to repent of our actions and our lack of seeking God, then he will help us through our difficulties.

We may feel that we have made serious mistakes and have lost God's plan for our lives. But God is a God of redemption and restoration and is capable of transforming a dreadful error into something good. Reflect on David's sin with Bathsheba, how he repented, and the birth of Solomon (2 Sam 11-12). Plan A becomes plan B but it can be converted by God into another glorious plan A.




