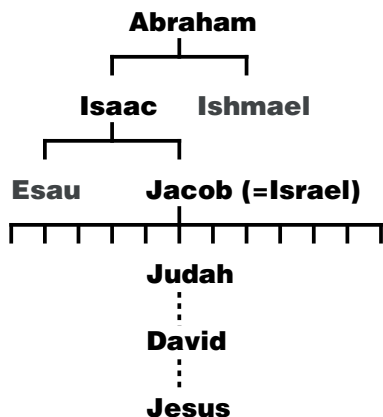

Families are important to God and there is plenty of information in the Bible showing how people were related and the purposes of God for families.

● Families in the Bible

Families were extended and more similar to those we find today in eastern cultures. They included several generations, servants and others incorporated into the household.

Having children was seen as blessing from the Lord, particularly sons who were inheritors and who continued the family line (*Psalms* 127:3-5).

Hebrew words

- The Hebrew word for "father" is *ab* (so *Abraham* = "father of many", *Abigail* = "my father is joy", *Abijah* = "my father is Yahweh" and the related Aramaic word *Abba*).
- Sometimes the word *ab* is also translated as "family" indicating the strong connection in Hebrew thinking between father and family.
- The word *bayit* which means "house" is also used for "family", for example the "house of David".
- A combination of the two words *bayit* and *ab* is often used for "family" and can be translated as "father's house".

● Father

The father is a central character in the family. He is responsible for the conduct of his family and the blessings of God upon it. It is his task to be a good example and to illustrate the fatherhood of God.

● Mother

The mother shares the leadership of the family and many of the responsibilities above (*Proverbs* 31:10-31). The Bible is full of examples of mothers showing tender sacrificial care for children. This is a vivid illustration of God's tender love for us (*Isaiah* 49:15-16, *Isaiah* 66:13).

● Brothers and sisters

The word brother is used quite widely even for distant relatives. Love, loyalty and support are expected from brothers and sisters (*Proverbs 17:17, 18:24*).

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● The family of God

The idea of family is used throughout the Bible.

• God is a family

God includes father and son and this family relationship is one of his eternal qualities (John 5:19-23, 14:9-13, 16:28, 17:5).

• As Christians we are children of God

We become children of God when we receive Jesus (John 1:12-13). God is our father (John 20:17, 1 John 3:1). We are adopted into his family (Ephesians 1:5). We are given the Spirit of sonship and can call God "Abba" (Romans 8:15-16). We are co-heirs with Christ (Romans 8:17). Male and female, Jew and Gentile, all receive full rights as sons of God (Galatians 3:26-4:7). We become brothers of Jesus (Matthew 12:49-50, Hebrews 2:10-12).

Some may find it difficult to accept God as father because they have had bad experience of their natural father. This is why we need the Holy Spirit which is the Spirit of sonship to enable us to relate to God as our father.

• The church is the family of God

Christians address each other as brothers (Acts 1:16, Romans 1:13). Family values of love, loyalty, friendship and support are expected among believers (John 13:34-35, Romans 12:10, James 2:14-17, 1 Thessalonians 4:9-10). Church leaders are called to care for their people as a parent cares for their family with love, care and discipline (Matthew 20:25-28, 1 Corinthians 4:14-17, 1 Thessalonians 2:7-12, 1 Timothy 3:4-5).

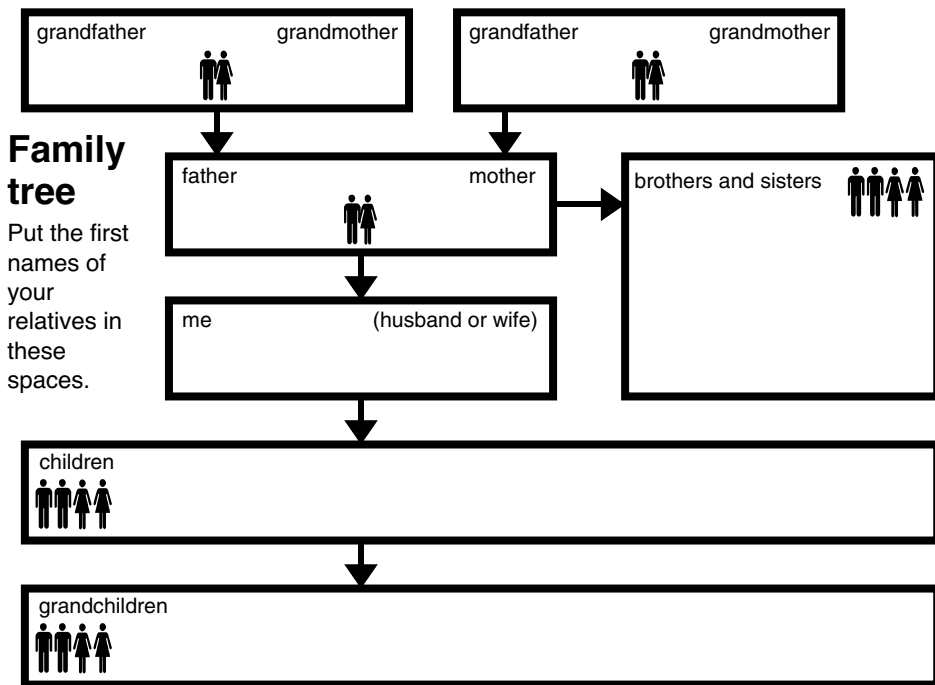
