

We are reconciled to God, no longer spiritually dead and have assurance of life beyond the grave with a new body.

Death is a gateway to the next stage of our eternal life.

Mourning and burial

Mourning — The Bible includes many examples of mourning. People weep, wail, groan, lament, tear clothes, wear sackcloth, fast, shave their heads, play sad music, sing a dirge, take off turban and sandals, cover the lower part of the face and wear no cosmetics (Gen 37:34, 2 Sam 1:11-27, 14:2, Ezek 24:15-24, Matt 9:23, 11:17, Luke 8:52, John 11:31-37, Acts 8:2, 9:39). Mourning took place for a week or for one or two months (Gen 50:1-11, Num 20:29, Deut 21:13, 34:8).

Christians are encouraged not to grieve like others (1

Thess 4:13). There is special comfort for those who mourn (Matt 5:4).

Burial — Close relatives walked behind the body to the burial (2 Sam 3:31-35, Luke 7:12-15). The body may have been wrapped in cloth with spices and buried in a family tomb (Gen 23:1-20, 25:9-10, 49:29-50:14, 2 Chron 35:24, John 11:38-44, 19:38-42), at home (1 Sam 25:1), near a landmark (Gen 35:8), under a monument (Gen 35:19-20) or in a common grave (2 Kings 23:6, Jer 26:23).

Cremation — Cremation was only practiced in special circumstances when immediate burial was impossible (1 Sam 31:11-13, 2 Sam 21:12-14).



Our fate is sealed by our response to the gospel in this life (*John 3:16-18*). Unbelievers also wait after death but away from the presence of the Lord (*Luke 16:19-31*). Their resurrection is later than that of the believers and they immediately face God's judgment (*Revelation 20:13*).



• Old Testament perspective

The Hebrew word *Sheol* (NIV "grave") described a shadowy existence of darkness, silence and weakness after death (*Job 10:20-22, Ps 30:9, 88:10-12, 89:48, 115:17, Prov 15:24, Is 14:9-11*). Occasionally there are optimistic statements describing release from *Sheol* and resurrection from the dead (*Job 19:25-26, Ps 16:10-11, 23:4-6, 49:15,*

73:24, Prov 14:32, Is 26:19, Dan 12:2, 12:13).

Jesus proclaimed the resurrection of the dead by his teaching, his miracles and his own resurrection (*Mark 12:18-27, John 11:17-44, 20:1-21:25*)

• Ghosts and spirits

Any form of communication with the dead is strictly forbidden in the Bible. We should not consult mediums, attend seances or engage in any activity which seeks to contact dead people (*Lev 19:31, 20:6, 20:27, Deut 18:11, 1 Sam 28:1-25, 1 Chron 10:13-14, Is 8:19*). God himself may choose to demonstrate resurrection in special circumstances (*Luke 9:30-31, Matt 27:51-53*).
